safety and usage information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Listening to a headset at high volumes can damage your hearing. Use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when airbags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone. Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries in a fire. Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated.
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

When sending text messages or playing games on your phone, hold the phone with a relaxed grip, press the buttons lightly, use special features that reduce the number of buttons you have to press (such as templates and predictive text), and take frequent breaks.

Safety precautions

Drive safely at all times

Avoid using your phone while driving and obey all regulations that restrict the use of mobile phones while driving. Use hands-free accessories to increase your safety when possible.

Follow all safety warnings and regulations

Comply with any regulations that restrict the use of a mobile phone in a certain area.

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

Your phone can cause interference with aircraft equipment. Follow all airline regulations and turn off your phone or switch to a mode that disables the wireless functions when directed by airline personnel.

Protect batteries and chargers from damage

- Avoid exposing batteries to very cold or very hot temperatures (below 0°C / 32°F or above 45°C / 115°F). Extreme temperatures can reduce the charging capacity and life of your batteries.
- Prevent batteries from contacting metal objects, as this can create a connection between the + and - terminals of your batteries and lead to temporary or permanent battery damage.
- Never use a damaged charger or battery.
- Risk of explosion if battery is replaced by an incorrect type. Dispose of used batteries according to the instructions

Handle your phone carefully and sensibly

- Do not allow your phone to get wet- liquids can cause serious damage. Do not handle your phone

with wet hands. Water damage to your phone can void your manufacturer's warranty.

- Avoid using or storing your phone in dusty, dirty areas to prevent damage to moving parts.
- Your phone is a complex electronic device—protect it from impacts and rough handling to avoid serious damage.
- Do not paint your phone, as paint can clog moving parts and prevent proper operation.
- Avoid using the phone's camera flash or light close to the eyes of children or animals.
- Your phone and memory cards may be damaged by exposure to magnetic fields. Do not use carrying cases or accessories with magnetic closures or allow your phone to come in contact with magnetic fields for extended periods of time.

Avoid interference with other electronic devices

Your phone emits radio frequency (RF) signals that may interfere with unshielded or improperly shielded electronic equipment, such as pacemakers, hearing aids, medical devices, and other electronic devices in homes or vehicles. Consult the manufacturers of your electronic devices to solve any interference problems you experience.

Use your phone in the normal position

Avoid contact with your phone's internal antenna.

Allow only qualified personnel to service your phone

Allowing unqualified personnel to service your phone may result in damage to your phone and will void your warranty.

Ensure maximum battery and charger life

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.
- Over time, unused batteries will discharge and must be recharged before use.

- Disconnect chargers from power sources when not in use.
- Use batteries only for their intended purpose.

Handle SIM cards and memory cards with care

- Do not remove a card while the phone is transferring or accessing information, as this could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Protect cards from strong shocks, static electricity, and electrical noise from other devices.
- Frequent writing and erasing will shorten the life span of memory cards.
- Do not touch gold-coloured contacts or terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.

Ensure access to emergency services

Emergency calls from your phone may not be possible in some areas or circumstances. Before travelling in remote or undeveloped areas, plan an alternate method of contacting emergency services personnel.

Specific Absorption Rate (SAR) certification information

Your phone conforms to European Union (EU) standards that limit human exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy emitted by radio and telecommunications equipment. These standards prevent the sale of mobile phones that exceed a maximum exposure level (known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR) of 2.0 watts per kilogram of body tissue.

During testing, the maximum SAR recorded for this model was 0.499 watts per kilogram. In normal use,

the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.

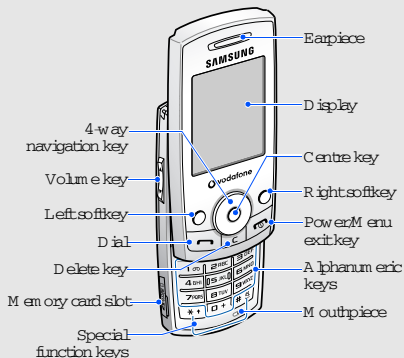

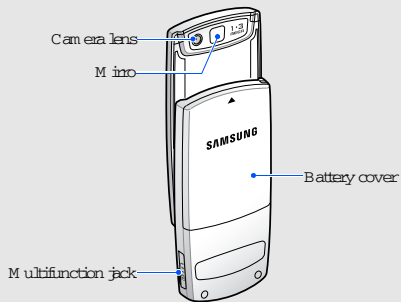

Closing the phone automatically locks the exposed keys to prevent you from accidentally pressing them. To unlock these keys, press <Unlock> → <OK>.

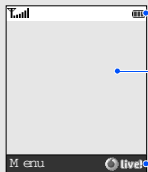

assembling and preparing your mobile phone

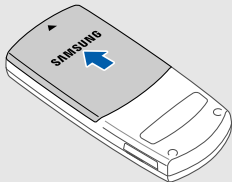
Get started by assembling and setting up
your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module, or SIM card, with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

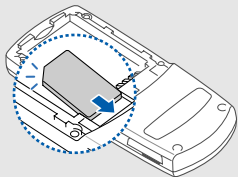
To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.



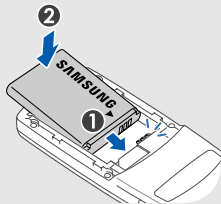
If the phone is on, press and hold [Power] to turn it off.

2. Insert the SIM card.

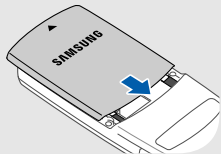


Place the card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.

3. Insert the battery.



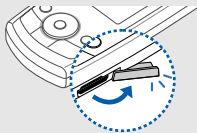
4. Replace the battery cover.



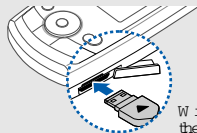
Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

1. Open the cover to the multifunction jack on the side of the phone.



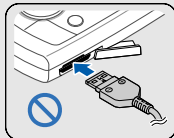
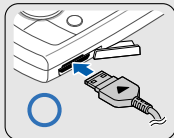
2. Plug the small end of the travel adapter into the jack.




With the triangle facing the front of your phone



Improperly connecting the adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.



3. Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
4. When the battery is fully charged (the  icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
5. Unplug the adapter from the phone.
6. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

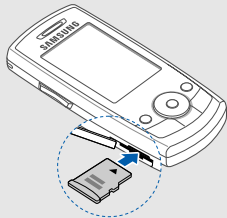
When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ memory cards up to 2 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type).

1. Open the cover to the memory card slot on the side of the phone.

2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing up.



3. Push the card in the slot until it locks in place.


To remove the memory card, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the card out of the slot.

using basic functions

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

1. Slide open the phone.
2. Press and hold .
3. Enter your PIN and press <OK> (if necessary).

To turn your phone off, repeat steps 1 and 2 above.

Switch to Offline profile

By switching to Offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplanes and hospitals.

To switch to Offline profile, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone settings → Phone profiles → Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

1. Press a softkey for the menu you want.
2. Use the navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
3. Press <Select>, <OK>, or the Centre key to confirm the highlighted option.
4. Press <Back> to move up one level; Press [↶] to return to Idle mode.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from Silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [#] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Change your ringtone

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone settings → Phone profiles.
2. Scroll to a profile.
3. Press <Options> → Edit → Voice call ringtone.
4. Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
5. Press <Options> → Save profile.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display settings → Home screen.
2. Select Wallpaper → an image category → an image.
3. Press <Save> .

Select a skin colour (Menu mode)

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Display settings → My theme.
2. Select a colour pattern.

Set menu shortcuts

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.

Lock your phone

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Settings → Security settings → Phone lock.
2. Select On.
3. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press <OK> .
4. Enter the new password again and press <OK> .



Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

1. In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
2. Press [↵] to dial the number.
3. To end the call, press [⏏].

Answer a call

1. When a call comes in, press [].
2. To end the call, press [].

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

1. During a call, press the Centre key → <Yes> to activate the speaker.
2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Centre key again.

Use the headset

By connecting the supplied headset to the multifunction jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button, and then press again and hold.
- To answer a call, press and hold the headset button.
- To end a call, press and hold the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send and view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), and email messages.

Send a text message

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create new message → Text message.
2. Enter your message text. ► p. 24

3. Press <Options> → **Send**.
4. Enter a destination number.
5. Press the Centre key to send the message.

Send a multimedia message

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create new message → Multimedia message.
2. Select Subject.
3. Enter a subject and press the Centre key.
4. Select Image or video or Music or sound.
5. Add an image, a video, music, or sound.
6. Select Text.
7. Enter your message text and press the Centre key.
8. Press <Options> → Send.
9. Enter a destination number or an email address.
10. Press the Centre key to send the message.

Send an email

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → Create new message → Email.
2. Select Subject.
3. Enter a subject and press the Centre key.
4. Select Message.
5. Enter your email text and press the Centre key.
6. Select File attach.
7. Attach multimedia files.
8. Press <Options> → Send.
9. Enter an email address.
10. Press the Centre key to send the message.

Enter text

When entering text, you can change the text input mode:

- Press and hold [*] to switch between T9 and ABC modes.
- Press [*] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode.

Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
T9	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Press the appropriate alphanumeric keys to enter an entire word. 2. When the word displays correctly, press [#] to insert a space. If the correct word does not display, press [0] to select an alternative word.
Number	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.

Mode	Function
Symbol	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key to select a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → My messages → Inbox.
2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Messages → My messages → Email inbox.
2. Select Check new mail.
3. Select an email or a header.
4. If you selected a header, press <Options> → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the Phonebook feature.

Add a new contact

1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press <Options> .
2. Select Save contact → a memory location (phone or SIM) → New .

3. Select a number type (if necessary).
4. Enter contact information.
5. Press <Save> or the Centre key to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Phonebook → Contact list.
2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
3. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [↵]
- edit the contact's information by pressing the Centre key

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Camera to turn on the camera.
2. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
3. Press the Centre key to take a photo.
The photo is saved automatically.
4. Press <Back> to take another photo (step 2).

View photos

In Idle mode, press <Menu> → My files → Images → My photos → a photo file.

Capture videos

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Camera to turn on the camera.
2. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.
3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
4. Press the Centre key to start recording.
5. Press <[]> or the Centre key to stop recording.
The video is saved automatically.
6. Press <[5]> to record another video (step 3).

View videos

In Idle mode, press <Menu> → My files → Videos → My video clips → a video file.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

Listen to the FM radio

1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's multifunction jack.
2. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Applications → FM radio.
3. Press the Centre key to start the radio.
4. Press <Yes> to start automatic tuning.
5. Scroll up or down to select a radio station.
6. To turn the radio off, press the Centre key.

Create a playlist and listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ Browse the web
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ Samsung PC Studio user manual
- Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 37
- Copy to your memory card. ▶ p. 18

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

1. In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Applications → Music player.
2. Press <Options> → Add music from → a memory type.
3. Select the files you want to include and press <Add>.

- Press the Centre key to begin playback.
- Control playback using the following keys:

Centre	Pause or resume playback
Volume	Adjust the volume up or down
Navigation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Left: Skip backward; Scan backward in a file (press and hold) Right: Skip forward; Scan forward in a file (press and hold) Up: Open the playlist Down: Stop playback

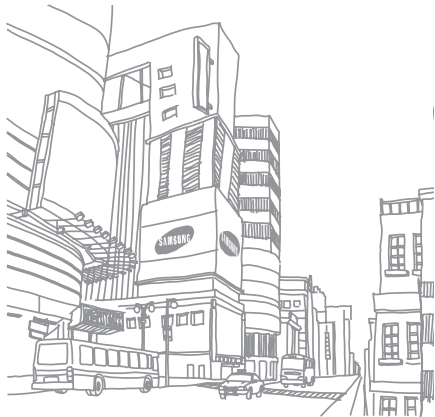

Use advanced call functions



Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

1. Press <View>.
2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
3. Press [> to dial.

Call a recently dialed number

1. In Idle mode, press [> to display a list of recent numbers.
2. Scroll to the number you want and press [> to dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press <Hold> to place a call on hold or press <Retrieve> to retrieve a held call.

Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

1. Press <Hold> to put the first call on hold.
2. Enter the second number to dial and press [↵].
3. Press <Swap> to switch between the two calls.
4. To end the call on hold, press <Options> → End held call.
5. To end the current call, press [⏏].

Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

1. Press [↵] to answer the second call.
The first call is automatically placed on hold.
2. Press <Swap> to switch between the calls.

Make a multiparty call (conference call)

1. Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
2. While connected to the first party, call the second party.
The first party is automatically placed on hold.
3. When connected to the second party, press <Options> → Join.

- Repeat steps 1 and 2 to add more parties (if necessary).
- To end the multiparty call, press [↵].

Call an international number

- In Idle mode, press and hold [0] to insert the + character.
- Enter the complete number you want to dial (country code, area code, and phone number), and then press [↵] to dial.

Call a contact from the Phonebook

You can call numbers directly from the Phonebook using stored contacts. ► [p.25](#)

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Phonebook → Contact list.
- Scroll to the number you want to dial and press [↵] to dial.

Use advanced Phonebook functions

Learn to create namecards, set speed dial numbers, and create groups of contacts.

Create a namecard

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Phonebook → My namecard.
- Enter your personal details and press <Options> → Save.



You can send your namecard by attaching it to a message or email or transferring it via the Bluetooth wireless feature.

Set speed dial numbers

- In Idle mode, press <Menu> → Phonebook → Speed dial.
- Scroll to a number you want to set (2-9) and press the Centre key.

3. Select a contact to assign to the number.
The contact is saved to the speed dial number.



You can now call this contact from Idle mode by pressing and holding the assigned speed dial number.

Create a group of contacts

By creating groups of contacts, you can assign ringtones and caller ID photos to each group or send messages and emails to an entire group. Start by creating a group:

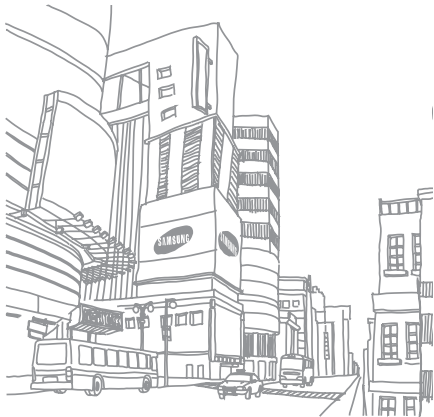

troubleshooting

When you turn on your phone, the following messages may appear:


M message	Try this to solve the problem :
Insert SIM	Ensure that the SIM card is installed correctly.
Phone lock	When the phone lock feature is enabled, you must enter the password you set for the phone.
Enter PIN	When using the phone for the first time or when the PIN requirement is enabled, you must enter the PIN supplied with the SIM card. You can disable this feature by using the PIN lock menu.

M message	Try this to solve the problem :
Enter PUK	Your SIM card is blocked, usually as a result of entering your PIN incorrectly several times. You must enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

Your phone displays "No service," "Network failure," or "Not done."

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.
- You cannot access some options without a subscription. Contact your service provider for more details.

You enter a number, but the call is not dialed.

- Ensure that you have pressed the Dial key: [].
- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot reach you.

- Ensure that your phone is turned on.

- Ensure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Ensure that you have not set call barring for the phone number.

Another caller cannot hear you speaking.

- Ensure that you are not covering the built-in microphone.
- Ensure that the microphone is close to your mouth.
- If using a headset, ensure that it is properly connected.

The phone beeps and the battery icon flashes.

Your battery is low. Recharge or replace the battery to continue using the phone.

The audio quality of the call is poor.

- Ensure that you are not blocking the phone's internal antenna.

- When you are in areas with weak signals or poor reception, you may lose reception. Move to another area and try again.

You select a contact to call, but the call is not dialled.

- Ensure that the correct number is stored in the contact list.
- Re-enter and save the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or sometimes the phone turns itself off.

- The battery terminals may be dirty. Wipe both gold-coloured contacts with a clean, soft cloth and try charging the battery again.
- If the battery will no longer charge completely, dispose of the old battery properly and replace it with a new battery.
